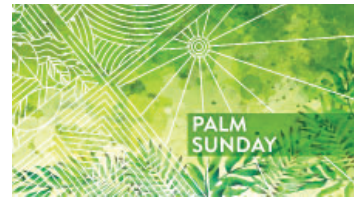


DAILY READING PLAN

Week of April 10, 2022

Jesus Parade

Luke 19:28-48



Day One | Read Luke 19:28-34

²⁸ After he had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. ²⁹ When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, ³⁰ saying, "Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³¹ If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it.'" ³² So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. ³³ As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" ³⁴ They said, "The Lord needs it."

- Are you ever fuzzy on the aims and goals of Jesus? How has that impacted your discipleship journey and your sense of the goal of the local church?

Day Two | Read Luke 19:35-38

³⁵ Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. ³⁶ As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. ³⁷ As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, ³⁸ saying, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!"

- Pretend that Jerusalem is your heart and priorities in life. How would you lay out the red carpet for Jesus to enter? In other words, what does your devotional life look like right now?

Day Three | Read Luke 19:39

³⁹ Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop."

- Who are the pharisees in your life causing you to mellow out your praise of Jesus? Who are the people that would encourage you to shout even louder?

Day Four | Read Luke 19:45-46

⁴⁵ Then he entered the temple and began to drive out those who were selling things there; ⁴⁶ and he said, "It is written, 'My house shall be a house of prayer'; but you have made it a den of robbers."

- The temple was understood to be the place where heaven and earth met most fully. Now, through the power of Jesus' spirit in us, that place is your heart. The center of your being. Would Jesus need to drive anything out of your heart in order to teach there? If so, what would it be?

Day Five | Read Luke 19:47-48

⁴⁷ Every day he was teaching in the temple. The chief priests, the scribes, and the leaders of the people kept looking for a way to kill him; ⁴⁸ but they did not find anything they could do, for all the people were spellbound by what they heard.

- When was the last time you felt spellbound in worship or in prayer? What was the quality of that experience? How would you describe it? What do you think it was about Jesus' teaching then that captivated the people in the temple? Would it be something that would captivate us now?
