- Today's Bible Story:** John 6:1-14 | Jesus Feeds 5,000
(Spark Story Bible pg. 426 | Hands on Bible pg. 1048)
- Today's Bottom Line:** God will use whatever we bring to show love to others.
- Monthly Memory Verse:** Here is what love is. It is not that we loved God. It is that he loved us and sent his Son to give his life to pay for our sins. 1 John 4:10 (NIRV)
- Monthly Virtue:** Love—Showing others how much they matter to you
- Basic Truth:** I should treat others the way I want to be treated.

Opening Activity (10:30 - 10:40 am)

Highs and Lows: As kids arrive, ask about the “highs and lows” of their week. Another good icebreaker question is “What’s something funny that happened this week?”

Word Search & Name the Fish: These activity sheets can be colored, solved, and discussed as a primer for today’s bible story.

GROUPS: Creating a Safe Place to Connect (11:15 - 11:30 am)

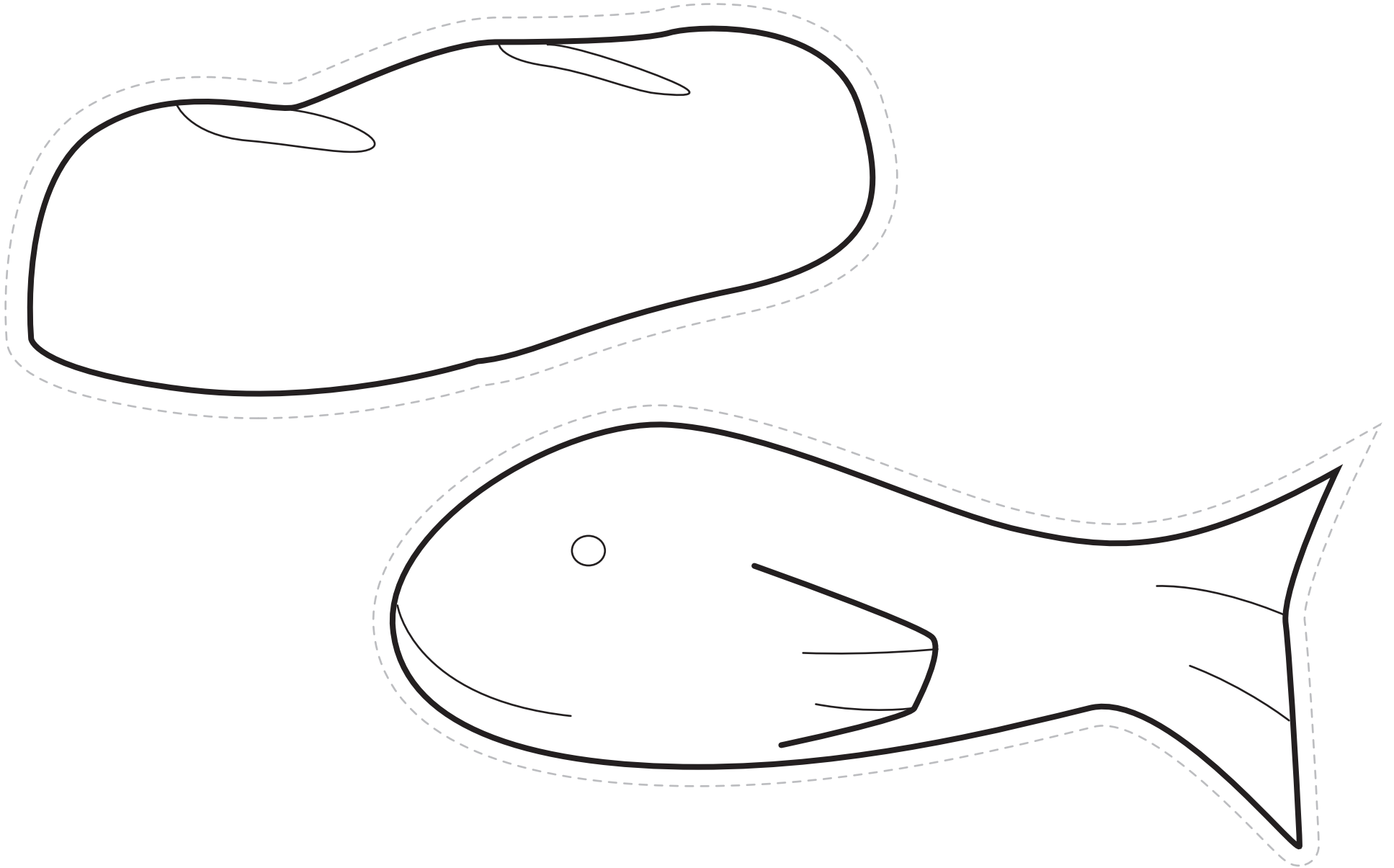
Fishes & Loaves Template: After the kids get back to their groups, have everyone cut out the fish and loaf from their activity page.

What to say: *“Today we’ve been hearing and thinking about how Jesus can use kids just like you to show love and care to others by using whatever they’re willing to bring to help. What’s one thing you could do this week to show Jesus’ love? Write or draw that on the back of the bread loaf. What’s one big idea you have to help others? Write or draw this on the back of the fish, or use a blank piece of paper.”*

Ask kids to share what they came up with!

Pray: *“Dear God, thank you for the ideas we’ve just shared and the things we learned today about how you will use whatever we bring to show love to others. Help us to share generously with others in need, just like the boy in today’s story who trusted that you could use whatever he offered to you. In Jesus’ name we pray. AMEN.”*

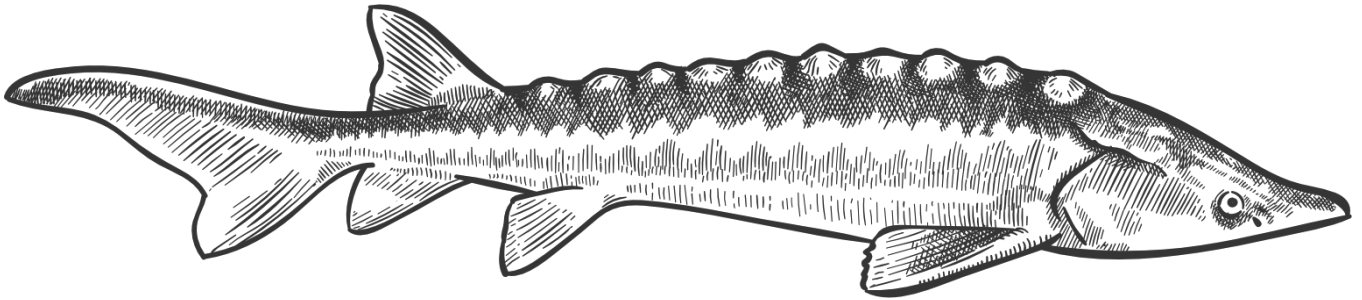

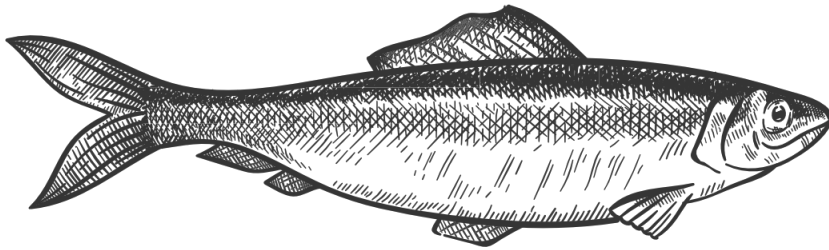

We don't know what fish the boy had in his basket, only that they were small, but can you name these fish?

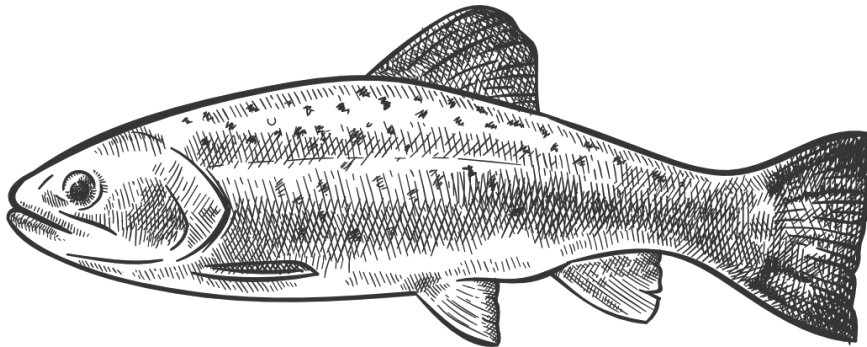

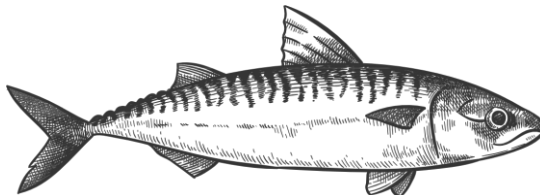

FACT:

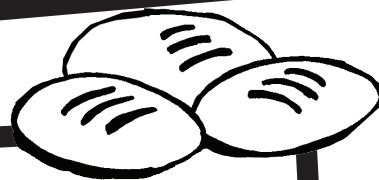
