IT'S PERSONAL:

A SERIES ABOUT JESUS & ZACCHAEUS

Students all have one thing in common: They want to be seen, known, and valued for who they are. They don't want fake relationships; they want personal ones. In this series, we'll be studying Jesus' interactions with Zacchaeus. We'll see three ways Jesus made it personal and what that means for our lives.

We're taking a cue from the way Jesus did it to learn how to make everything—including our relationship with Jesus—a little more personal.

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**MORNING TIME**

Time is precious, especially in the lives of teenagers. Before you know it, your teen will be all grown up. One day this month, treat your teenager to breakfast at their favorite restaurant or coffee at their favorite coffee shop.

Spend quality one-on-one time with them, learning more about who they are and who they are becoming.

**THEIR TIME**

The next time your teen asks for advice, ask them clarifying questions before sharing your thoughts. Seek to fully understand the situation at hand and how your teen is feeling before you seek to be understood. Really listen to what they have to say before formulating a response. Not only will your teen feel loved and understood, but it will be an opportunity to build trust with your teen.

**MEAL TIME**

One of the simplest ways to show that you value someone is by knowing and using their name. So some day when you are eating dinner together, have a conversation with your teen about their name. Talk to them about where it came from, what it means, and why you chose it specifically for them.

**BED TIME**

Your teen needs to be reminded of how much you love them, no matter what they do or don't do! To help them believe and internalize this, make it a habit to repeat this phrase to them every night before they head to bed: "I love you no matter what." The more you say it, the more they'll come to believe it and see you as a safe, loving place they can come to with anything.

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
